

## Presenting with an impact: improve and practice giving academic presentations

How do you create a memorable academic presentation that retains your audience's attention? This training will enable participants to become aware of their presentation style and pitfalls when presenting in English, and they will be equipped with practical tools to design and deliver captivating presentations and learn how to speak with confidence, ease, and impact in front of an (international) audience.

In addition to working on the stringent and creative structure and linguistic design of scientific presentations, the workshop also aims to increase participants' awareness of socio-cultural aspects of communication in Anglo-Saxon conference contexts, including the development of "elevator pitches". Regardless of your level of English you will learn how to give the presentation and handle the Q&A in English. All participants will have the opportunity to either work on a presentation they are preparing or to draft a new one and everyone will receive immediate feedback from both the group and the trainer.
